Minutes of previous meetings: The minutes of the May 12, 2015 meeting were reviewed. A motion to approve was made by Hemstock, a second by Holland; a vote of 5-0 was entered. The minutes of the May 26, 2015 Budget Workshop meeting were reviewed. A motion to approve was made by Hemstock, a second was made by Holland a vote of 5-0 was entered

Kent County Sheriff's Report: There was no report.

Maryland Environmental Services Report: Don Reed reviewed the report for May 2015. There were no violations at the WWTP or the WTP. 5 locates were performed.

Financial Report: The financial report was reviewed.

Town Administrator Report: The Town Administrator's Report was reviewed. Acquisition proposals were submitted to the Council for approval for the MEMA/FEMA program to purchase land in Queen Anne's County. A motion to approve the proposals was made by Hemstock, a second was made by Rice; a vote of 5-0 was entered. The rain garden was discussed and the rain garden cannot be removed because it was done with grant money.

Code Enforcement Report: The Code Enforcement report was reviewed. Morales mentioned that the car at 201 Sassafras Street has been removed.

Engineer Report: Mountaire Project Comments need to be completed. The street design is on hold until we figure out what Mountaire is doing.

Old Business:

- Recycling: Ford Schumann presented how Infinity could help the town with recycling instead of taking the recycling to Kent County. The Council received a letter from James Baxter regarding how he feels about recycling with Infinity. This discussion will be tabled until the next meeting.
- Crossing Guard: Tracey Rodney, principle of Millington Elementary School was present to express that they would like the town to continue to provide a crossing guard for the school. She mentioned that there have been cuts in the County's Education Budget. After discussion, it was concluded that Millington would try to host a flagging course if we can find enough people and to try to include Galena. Having the Sheriff's Department provide a deputy to be a crossing guard was another option that the Council would like to look into.

New Business:

- Public Hearing: Amending FY 2015 Budget – Resolution 2015-03: Morales opened the public hearing by

reading aloud Resolution 2015-03. there was no public comment. A motion to adopted Resolution 2015-03 was made by Hemstock, a second was made by Rice a vote of 5-0 was entered.

- Public Hearing: Adopting FY 2016 Budget – Resolution 2015-04: Morales opened the public hearing by reading aloud Resolution 2015-04. There was no public comment. A motion to adopted resolution 2015-04 with the year change on the Resolution was made by Rice, a second was made by Holland; a vote of 5-0 was entered.
- Millington Day Parade Permit: Parade to take place on 9/12/2015. A motion to approve the permit and waive the fee was made by Hemstock, a second was made by Rice; a vote of 4-0-1 was entered with Morales abstaining from the vote.

Correspondence: All correspondence was reviewed.

Upcoming Events: Upcoming meetings were reviewed.

With no further business to discuss a motion to adjourn was made by Rice, a second by Hemstock; a vote of 5-0 was entered.
